Reception

Reception had fun in the snow during their outdoor play sessions.









Year 1 - DT

Year 4 - Geography & Science

Year 4 have been learning all about Volcanoes and have even created art work based on their knowledge and learning.

And it looks like they had great fun learning about the digestive system in Science





Year 5 - Geography


As part of their learning about Rivers, Year 5 acted out the journey of a river, to help gain a clearer understanding of the middle course of a river, ox-bow lakes and meanders. After drawing a meandering river on the playground, they linked arms, in groups of 4, and followed the river's path. They found that the people on the outside of the bend had to move more quickly. This represented the fast flowing waters that cause river banks to erode over time. The person on the inside of the bend moved more slowly and dropped bean bags to represent the deposition of soil, sand and other debris that slow moving water leaves behind.

Year 6 - Science

Y6 investigated what happens when sunlight enters a prism. They learnt that the white light is refracted, due to the material (glass) being denser than the air. This results in the light splitting into the 7 pure colours of the visible spectrum: red, orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo and violet.









The Hive


The children in The Hive have been reading 'We're Going on A Bear Hunt', they made bear pancakes.

Because the children have got really into skipping at lunchtime, Ms Harrold organised a skipping challenge!

103 children signed up to take part and on Wednesday 13th November, the sports leaders helped Ms Harrold & Mr Ludlam count the number of continuous skips, each contestant could do.

Focus on ...Dudley Family Hubs

Dudley's family hub network includes five local family hubs, along with online resources and community services which support children and families across the borough. The local family hubs are located at Brierley Hill, Coseley, Dudley, Lye and Stourbridge.

Where is my local family hub?

Dudley family hub

There are currently five local family hubs around the borough that can offer support to you and your family. They are open Monday - Friday, 9am-5pm. They are located at:

What is the family hub network?

The network is a one-stop shop, offering advice and support for families in Dudley with children aged 0-19 (25 if the child has special educational needs and/or disabilities). It includes an online offer and five local family hubs. The network includes key Start for Life services. These cover the period from conception to age two. Core Start for Life services such as midwifery, health visiting, and early years support are included.

What can people expect from Dudley's local family hubs?

The hubs are welcoming places where parents-to-be, parents, carers, families and young people can get help all from one place.

Family hubs are local and accessible, linking families to the right services for them, when they need them.

What do the local family hubs currently offer?

The local family hubs aim to provide expectant parents and families with children up to the age of 18 (25 with additional needs and/or physical or learning disabilities) with advice, practical support and information, as well as support from other parents.

They offer help to ensure babies, children and young people get the best start for life and meet their full potential and that parents and carers receive any help they need to raise their families.

The hubs provide a broad range of support services across the borough. These currently include:

- midwives
- health visiting
- parenting and baby groups
- baby Ccinics
- Citizens Advice
- pre-natal support
- signposting to services and groups
- family support
- and much more
